In keeping with its focus on education and enhancement of practice standards, the Society has annually awarded stipends (currently \$2000 each) to outstanding young trainees interested in obtaining further training in specific areas of surgical pathology at another institution. These awards are designed to support advanced training in subspecialty areas (or with faculty having special expertise) not available at the individual's home institution. The Society also awards the Arthur Purdy Stout Prize annually for the most outstanding individual under the age of 45 years in the field of surgical pathology. Last year, the prize was awarded to Dr. Gladell Paner of The University of Chicago. This year's award goes to Dr. Khin Thway of The Royal Marsden Hospital. Last year Dr. Elaine Jaffe received the President's Award for her highly significant contributions over her outstanding career. This year's award winner is Dr. Linda Ferrell of UCSF in honor of her work and brilliant career in liver pathology.

In regard to educational activities, the APSS continues to offer a highly attended companion society meeting at the annual USCAP meeting. Drs. Vania Nose and Rhonda Yantiss serve as Co-Chairs of the Program Committee. This year, the program is entitled, "**There are No Magic Bullets : When Immunostains Can Get You Into Trouble**". An outstanding panel of expert speakers will include Dr. Jesse McKenney (Cleveland Clinic), Dr. John Hart (University of Chicago), Judith Ferry (Massachusetts General Hospital), Teri Longacre (Stanford, CA), Andrew Folpe (Mayo Clinic), and David Klimstra (Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center). In addition, the Arthur Purdy Stout Society Lecture at the ASCP annual meeting this past year was given by Dr. Teri Longacre on September 16 in Las Vegas. This lecture was entitled "**Lynch Screening in the Female Genital Tract: Where Are We Now and Where Are We Headed?**"

The APSS maintains its relationship with its official journal, *The American Journal of Surgical Pathology*. Lastly, the APSS will continue to work closely with the other major pathology societies of which many of its members are also members, including the CAP, ASCP and USCAP.
